



LaVille Elementary Bullying Assessment Protocols

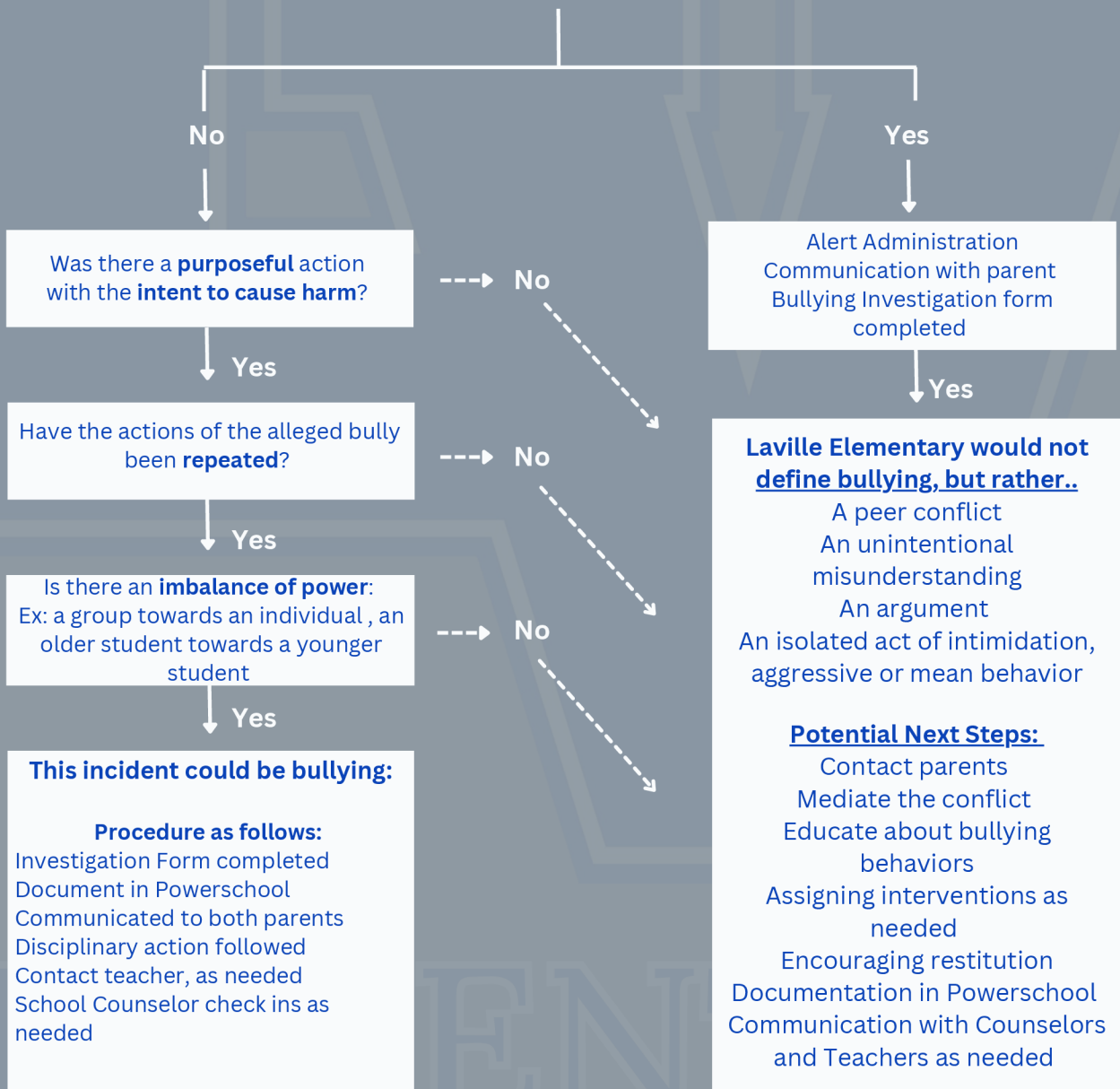


Bullying Definition: "Bullying" is defined as overt, unwanted, repeated acts or gestures, including verbal or written communications or images transmitted in any manner (including digitally or electronically); physical acts committed; aggression; or any other behaviors committed by a student or group of students against another student with the intent to harass, ridicule, humiliate, intimidate, or harm the targeted student, creating for the targeted student an objectively hostile school environment

Step 1: Bullying Complaint form is completed and turned in to school counselors

Step 2: Investigation begins within 24 hours. Interviews are held with those involved or aware of the situation

Step 3: Determine if a crime has been committed in this situation. Crime may include: physical injury, use or threat of weapons, loss or damage of personal property



Due to FERPA laws protecting a student's right to privacy, disciplinary consequences cannot be shared with individuals outside the legal guardians.
